DSGA General Meeting Minutes April 14, 2018

President Mark Franklin called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m. and welcomed our guests.

Mark told the club that the minutes of the February meeting had been sent out to everyone. He asked for additions and corrections. None were made; therefore, a motion was taken and seconded to accept the minutes as printed in the email. The motion was accepted.

Jack Rigsby gave the treasurer's report. He sent a check to AHS in memory of two of our club members who have died recently. He also paid the dues for DSGA to belong to the Garden Club of Georgia for two years. A motion was made and seconded to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was accepted. Jack announced that the audit had been completed by Palmer Haffner and Carolyn Herndon and thanked them for their time.

Mark asked for a vote to accept the proposal that our DSGA club has made to change the name of the Region 5 Photo Contest to the Dennis Calbreath Memorial Photo Contest so that it could be presented at the Region 5 Spring meeting in June. The guidelines were printed in the last DSGA Newsletter. Mark explained that the DSGA Club gives \$200.00 to the Region 5 every year, and that money would be used for this contest. A motion was made and seconded that we accept this proposal. He said the amount for the photo contest donated by DSGA would be \$300.00. A clarification was discussed about the money amount to be changed in the proposal to \$300.00. A second motion to clarify the amount of money to be given to the Region for the photo contest was made and seconded. The motion passed.

Next, the club was asked to vote on the amendment to the DSGA Bylaws to change the term of office dates to begin terms on January 1 of each year. The terms of officers would end on December 31 each year. A motion was made and seconded to change the Bylaws to state this change. The motion was accepted. The corrected Bylaws will go on our DSGA website soon.

The Daylily Education was given by Jessie Worsham who presented a power point for Off Scape Display for Daylily Shows.

Plant sales was the next topic of discussion. Club members promote the daylily by educating the community about them and reaching out to get new members to join our AHS club. The Forsyth Master Gardeners Sale has been going on this weekend, and Jack announced that the sales have been very successful to date having already collected around \$1,000.00 . The Bulloch Hall Sale will be April 28. Virgil and Carolyn Herndon and Jack and Cynthia Rigsby have volunteered to work at the sale. Virgil will need help to dig, divide, clean, and label plants before the sale. He will the determine the date to do this later, and Mark will send an email out to let members to know date, time and place.

Mark announced that the month of June will be very busy for our club and that we will need everyone's participation in our many activities. Patty Franklin discussed the June 23 Daylily Off-scape Show. It will not be an accredited show, but it will keep the momentum going to educate the public and keep the annual flower sale going. There will be tags to fill out to enter your off-scape blooms which will be displayed in

small bottles provided by the club or on a peg board. The set-up will be on Friday at 5:30 p.m. All of our activities – display of off-scape blooms, the photo contest, the plant sale, and the potluck luncheon – will be in the one big room that the show was in last year. Mats and easels will be provided for 5x7 photo prints to be displayed. There will be no design portion this year. Patty said this show will be all about publicity and education of the public and fun.

Next Claude Carpenter talked about the Region 5 Spring Meeting which will be June 15-16 at the Hilton Garden Inn in Alpharetta. He encouraged all of our members to register for this meeting. We are hosting this meeting and **need participation from all of our members.** The three gardens which will be toured on Saturday are: the Franklin's, the Kovach's, and the Carpenter's. The Garden Judges Class, part II will be in the Kovach's garden. Claude reminded the club members about the importance of becoming a Garden Judge. They determine all of the AHS Awards every year. The tour will leave at 7:30 from the hotel. Included in the registration fee are the tour busses, two evening meals (Friday and Saturday nights), and lots of fun. After the meal on Friday night, there will be a plant auction. You may get a registration form from Patty, our DSGA website, or the Georgia Daylily (which everyone received recently as a member of AHS).

Mark gave a report about Mike and Dorothy Warren who were not present at the meeting. He thanked them for all of the years of service to the club as chair of the Hospitality Committee. They did an outstanding job. He also asked the members to consider taking on this responsibility. Please call Mark if you are interested in this position.

A question was asked about offering people opportunities to join our club. Names and email addresses are taken at the plant sales. Thank you for attending our plant sale emails are sent to those leaving their addresses, and all are invited to attend our meetings. These people are also sent a copy of our newsletter.

Pam Haffner introduced our speaker, Bob Faulkner. Bob presented a very interesting and educational program. After his program, Bob auctioned 7 of this daylily introductions.

After the auction, everyone enjoyed a potluck lunch provided by members.



DSGA Board Meeting Minutes

August 26, 2018

The August 26, 2018 DSGA Board Meeting was held at the Franklins' home, and Mark Franklin, president, called the meeting to order at 2:05 PM. Mark welcomed everyone and thanked them for coming.

Since the board had not met since March 25, Mark asked Cynthia Rigsby to read the minutes from that meeting. Mark asked for additions or corrections. There being none, a motion was made and seconded to accept them as read. They were accepted.

Jack Rigsby, treasurer, distributed two hand-outs regarding the revenue and expenses for DSGA and the 2018 Region 5 Spring Meeting and gave the financial reports for each. He first gave the statistics and expenses for the Region 5 Meeting. Attached is a copy of the report 2018 Region 5 Spring Meeting, June 15, 2018 thru June 17, 2018 explaining the revenues and expenses of this meeting. Next, he went over the Daylily Society of Greater Atlanta Cash Receipts/Disbursements for the Period of 3-26-18 thru 8-26-18. He explained why a couple of items appeared on this statement. Jack also said that during the past 5 months our 3 plant sales have netted us approximately \$3,500.00. Mark asked for questions about the financial report. There being none, a motion was made and seconded to accept the report. The report passed.

Under Old Business, Mark announced there would be no Education Corner for our next meeting due to the many activities on the agenda.

Claude Carpenter, Chair of the 2018 Region 5 Meeting June 14 and 15, gave a report on the meeting. He thinks it was very successful because he has received so many positive responses about the location, hotel, gardens, and food.

A brief discussion was prompted by Pam Haffner about how to get better participation and members of young people.

The upcoming plant sale at the Duluth Fall Festival September 29 and 30 was discussed. The Metz's and Jack will head up this sale. Volunteers are needed to help set up, sell plants, collect email addresses of attendees, and clean up. The Herndons, Carpenters, Franklins, Verners, and Rigsbys said that they could contribute plants for the sale. It was estimated that we will need 500-600 double fans because we sold out of plants by about 10:30 AM on Sunday last year. Members are encouraged to donate plants which have lost the name markers, but bundle them with different plants in each bundle. Names of plants need to go to Claude so that he can print pictures for display. Patty Franklin volunteered to order more 10"plant labels.

Patty gave a report about the DSGA 2018 Show. She gave ideas for getting memberships at the show. She said to ask attendees to fill out post cards reminding them of the next DSGA meeting. This way we would have the names and addresses as well as other information. Patty volunteered to make the post cards and have them by the Duluth sale in September. Pam Haffner suggested to go among the crowd and hand out free daylilies if people would visit our sales table. Another idea was to give a free membership to those who make a purchase at least \$25.00. Carolyn said that we should take old journals of *The Georgia Daylily and the Daylily Journal* to give to customers to show them what they can get by becoming members.

A discussion also ensued about how to get more people to attend the daylily show. Jesse talked about advertising in local papers to get more people to attend. Patty said that next year we will keep the off-scape and the photo contests. Everyone was in agreement that both should be judged by the public. The awards for the winners of this year's show will be made at the next general meeting.

The next item on the agenda was the Region 5 Photo Contest. The DSGA club voted at the last meeting to propose to Region 5 a name change for the photo contest to the Dennis Calbreath Memorial Photo Contest. If Region 5 approves this change at the October meeting in Warner Robbins, DSGA will fund the awards for the contest equaling \$200.00 plus \$100.00 to Region 5 general fund for an amount of \$300.00 to be paid to Region 5 every year beginning in 2019.

At the last DSGA general meeting, the club voted to change the By-Laws' Article 11, Section 4 to state *New officers shall assume their duties at the first board meeting in January following their election in September. This will allow for newly elected officers to meet with the out-going officers to learn their responsibilities. Term of office will be for two years beginning January 1 and ending December 31.* Jack said that this change should have a trail by including it in the minutes. He also stated that the Constitution and By-Laws should be kept by the Secretary. Mark said this should also be posted on our website and asked Claude if he would make this update. Claude will update as soon as he gets the proper wording.

The Fowlers from Valdosta will be our speakers following a short business meeting on September 15. They will be bringing some of their introductions to auction. Pictures of the plants will be posted when received. Lunch will be after the Fowlers' auction. The annual MAPS Auction will take place after lunch. Members will be able to buy plants purchased from Sandy Holmes of Ohio with the points they have accumulated this past year for their participation in club activities. Those with leftover points may purchase plants from the Bargain Table. Members are encouraged to bring plants to donate to this sale and to price them before bringing them with a reasonable price. The table will not be available for anyone to purchase plants from it until after the MAPS Auction. Any amount over the MAPS amount for a purchase must be paid for in cash, check or credit card.

At the September meeting, Mark will ask if any one would like to volunteer to be on the board to replace the 3 members who are rotating off at the end of this year. If there are no responses, he will appoint a committee of 3 to search for members who would serve in this capacity.

Mark asked to review and approve the guidelines for DSGA speakers. The board has already approved a \$250.00 cap. The club will pay for one night in a hotel if the speaker is too far to come on the morning of the meeting. If the club takes the speaker to dinner the night before, the club will pay for the speaker and spouse; officers attending the dinner will pay for their own meals. Air fare (for guest speakers only, not spouse) or mileage based on GSA rates will be paid, and speakers **Must have Auction plants if they are a Hybridizer and split the proceeds from the auction of those plants 50/50 with the club (DSGA).**

A long discussion ensued about the amount that DSGA should give to Region 5 this year as a result of money made from the June 14, 15 meeting. Jack explained why Region 5 needs money to keep the <u>Georgia Daylily</u> in business. He mentioned that this award-winning magazine costs \$2,700.00 each time it is printed; the cost per issue is about \$8.00. This money comes mainly from memorials to the region because few clubs donate for this cause. An amount of \$2,000.00 was suggested to give to the region for this purpose; then another suggestion was \$2,500.00. Mark asked for the board to vote on these numbers, but there were questions about the amount. A vote was taken, and each amount received 4 votes. There was one person abstaining. Harold McDonell made a motion that we donate \$2,300.00. Jack seconded the motion and for question for vote. A vote was taken and the \$2,300.00 was accepted.

Carolyn Herndon asked about DSGA donating funds to a scholarship program for students majoring in horticulture. The idea was tabled so that Carolyn could find out information about schools with such programs.

Jack asked the board to think about the plant sales for 2019 because the vendors are already sending out the invitations and want to be paid. Jack suggested that we keep all four sales, and asked if the board would vote to keep all of them. Mark tabled this until a later time.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

DSGA Board Meeting Minutes

March 25, 2018

The March 25, 2018 Board Meeting of the Daylily Society of Greater Atlanta was called to order at 2:13 p.m. by president Mark Franklin. Mark welcomed everyone and thanked Bruce and Pat Kovach for inviting us to their home for the meeting. Mark announced that the 2018 Region 5 Committee Meeting would follow immediately after the board meeting.

Cynthia Rigsby reported that the minutes of the last DSGA Board Meeting were published in the last newsletter. Mark asked for approval of the minutes as written in the newsletter. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept them as published.

The treasurer's report was given by Jack Rigsby who said that there is \$16, 047.48 in our bank account. There are no outstanding bills except for Julie Covington's plane ticket for the Spring Regional Meeting. Everyone received a handout of the financial report. A motion was made and seconded to accept the financial report as delivered. The report was accepted by the members. Jack announced that the yearly audit would be done at the Rigsbys' home on March 30 by Palmer Haffner and Carolyn Herndon.

Pam Haffner talked about the Daylily Education for our April 14 General Meeting. She said the Jessie Worsham will share a power point presentation about displaying off-scape flowers.

A discussion for the up-coming plant sales was next. The Forsyth County Master Gardeners sale is Friday, April 13 and Saturday, April 14. Barbara and Herb Metz will be in charge of the sale. The Saturday sale is during our next DSGA General Meeting. Barbara and Herb will cover the sale during that time. Everyone else is encouraged to attend the meeting. Bruce Kovach will donate the majority of the plants for this sale. There was discussion about how many plants would be needed for each sale. It was decided that around 200 double fans would be sufficient. The Herndons will donate the majority of the plants for the Bulloch Hall sale on Saturday, April 28. The Franklins volunteered for the newer plants for the Region 5 sale, and everyone is encouraged to donate to the Duluth sale and for the DSGA Show. A discussion followed about how much to charge for our plants. The majority seemed to be in favor of raising the prices just a little.

On Thursday, April 12 at 10:00 a.m. members will meet at the Kovachs to clean and label the plants for the Forsyth sale. Patty said she would send out an email about the sale with a flyer attached. Members are encouraged to share this flyer with friends, family, HOA's and anyone else who might be interested.

The next topic of discussion was the DSGA Daylily Show 2018. Patty said she is working on displays for off-scape displays. She asked the board to consider investing in peg board to display the off-scape flowers. These could be used in future shows for popularity votes. She said she already has the mats and easels for the photo contest. The luncheon will be a pot luck where we have the flowers displayed. It will be a low-key buffet with members providing the food. There will be no design component because it is not going to be a certified show. Therefore, there will be no judges except for the public.

At the next meeting on April 14, the club will vote on our photo contest, the amendment to change the start-end time for officers, and the Region 5 photo contest. The guest speaker will be Bob Faulkner, Natural Selection Daylilies in Ohio. He has a good selection of patterned flowers. He will send a list of flowers which will be auctioned at the meeting. Pam Haffner said that for the MAPS Auction meeting in September we are getting \$1,000.00 of plants from Sandy Holmes. Both of these hybridizers will donate plants for our Region 5 Spring meeting.

Pam suggested that someone take her positions of Education Chairman or Publicity since she a lot of responsibilities being Vice President. Please contact Mark if you are interested.

It was announced that Emily Strickland, long-time member of DSGA, had died and suggested that the club make a \$200.00 donation to AHS in her memory. It was mentioned that Virginia Miller, who had been a member of the club for many years, also be honored. It was voted and accepted to send the \$200.00 donation in memory of both women. Since Dennis Calbreath, also a long-time member has passed, will be honored perpetually by naming the Region 5 Photo Contest after him, his name would not be included in the donation.

Mark announced that Mike and Dorothy Warren want to be replaced as Hospitality Chairmen due to health reasons. They have done an outstanding job for many years. The April meeting will be a potluck. Members are encouraged to bring heavy appetizers as well as pot luck dishes. The club will provide the plates, cups, etc.

It was suggested that at the next meeting all board members should be introduced so that the other members would know who they are. Claude added that all of our members are AHS Platinum Club members.

A discussion of how to get younger members was next. One suggestion was to have teaching booths at sales to teach how to grow daylilies. Carolyn Herndon will check on what to do at the Roswell sale. Jack Rigsby will find out how to get a time slot to talk on stage at the Duluth sale. Bruce Kovach said he could talk to instructors at Lanier Tech to find out how to get horticulture students interested in joining.

Brochures need to be updated and made for the next sale. Claude said he would have it printed if someone gets a copy to him.

There being no further business, Mark adjourned the meeting.

There were a total of 37 entries in our **1st DSGA Photography Section:**

Class 1 - Single Bloom (18 photos)

Class 2 - Multiple Blooms (8 photos)

Class 3 - Daylily Clump (5 photos)

Class 4 - Daylilies in the Landscape (3 photos)

Class 5 - Daylilies and Nature (3 photos)

Martha Carpenter won Photography Class 1, Single Bloom category; Photography Class 3, Daylily Clump category; and Photography Class 4, Daylilies in the Landscape category. Palmer Haffner Photography Class 2, Multiple blooms category. Patty Franklin Photography won Photograph Class 5, Daylilies and Nature category.

Each photos that received the most votes in their respective Class and received a \$25 award for the most popular photograph in their section. Thank you to Vicki Alsup for her photography work at the show!! XXXOOO!!!

152 "Off-Scape" Daylilies were entered in our show this year and they were evaluated and judged by our club members and visitors to the show. We had a total of 390 votes cast for each person's top 5 daylily blooms. And the results were *VERY CLOSE*!!

The entry receiving the MOST votes was #12, with 20 votes, "Entwined in the Vine" entered by Levi Alsup (earning a \$50 prize)

Then, #62, with 19 votes, "Hotlanta" entered by Royce Stanford, (earning a \$25 prize)

And, #115 with 13 votes, "Green Inferno" entered by Levi Alsup, (earning a \$25 prize)

And, #8 also with 13 votes, "Southern Winner" entered by Bruce Alsup, (earning a \$25 prize)

And our final top vote-getter was #78, with 12 votes, "Milk Chocolate" entered by Bruce Alsup (earning a \$25 prize)

Finally, an honorable mention to #2, with 11 votes, "Tropicana Treat" entered by Karen Mowry
