The ballots are tabulated by Region, therefore, be sure to **cast your vote by using the Region 5 ballot**. A copy of the Region 5 ballot can be obtained from the Region 5 website <u>www.ahsregion5.org</u> or from the Spring 2013 issue of The Georgia Daylily.

There are two ways you can submit your ballot.

- 1. Online submittal can be done thru the AHS website <u>www.daylilies.org</u> You will see a link on the left side of the home page titled "Popularity Poll: Ballot/Results". Simply click on Ballot and proceed thru the instructions to cast your ballot online.
- Completed ballots can be mailed to Region 5's Tabulator (Scott Elliott) whose address is located on the lower left-hand side of the ballot. NOTE: Ballots must be postmarked no later than September 1st.

DSGA BOARD MEETING MINUTES July 14, 2013 Karen Mowry

The Board met at the home of Bruce and Pat Kovach and we thank them very much for hosting the meeting. First on the agenda was reviewing the Minutes from the previous Board meeting by Secretary Karen Mowry. The next item was the Treasurer's report by Angie Tatum. Our balance as of June 30 was \$7,482.25. Angie also presented an Expense sheet from the 2013 joint show and a detailed analysis of our various daylily sales with comparisons to previous years. Angie and Jack Rigsby will meet soon to file the IRS papers for the tax-exempt status.

Felicity needs certain daylilies for the Stout garden and has given the list to Shirley to include in the newsletter. Some Board members own and are willing to divide some of the missing plants to donate for this purpose.

Our joint DSGA/CCDS show was a great success with 324 entries. Results have been reported to membership in an earlier email.

<u>MEETING TIME CHANGE</u>: Claude announced that we have a conflict with our 10:00 a.m. time for our Nov. 9 General Meeting at Bellmere. Members need to mark your calendars for a change in time on that day *to 3 p.m.* Because of the meeting time change, we will not have our usual lunch but will have snacks of some kind.

Claude also spoke of the Region 5 meeting to be held Oct. 11 and 12 which will fall in conjunction with a meeting of the AHS officers (they will meet Thursday afternoon and all day on Friday with their Board). An auction will be held on Thursday night and members of both DSGA and CCDS are invited for the auction and dessert. The Regional meeting will begin on Friday night and National officers will be guests. Members are also encouraged to attend on Saturday. The location will be the Renaissance Hotel at the Galleria in Cobb County. An email will be sent to members about this at a later date. Claude also announced that he has arranged for hybridizer Jamie Gossard to be our speaker at the Sept.7 General Meeting.

We will have an ice cream social *at the Franklin's home at 2 p.m. on Aug.* 17th. They will have a projector and screen set up in their carport where members can view photos of daylilies to be voted on in the Region 5 Popularity Poll. Members can vote for 10 (total) daylilies, 5 of which can be write-in votes). Anyone unable to attend is urged to vote online at the AHS website.

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DSGA BOARD MEETING MINUTES July 14, 2013 Karen Mowry

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President Patty Franklin then canvased Board members about the possibility of having a place where members can post plants for Sale or Trade. Angle suggested that a blog would be an easier way to accomplish this and members will be asked if this idea is appealing to them at the next General Meeting on September 7th. The most difficult part of this would be keeping the blog up-to-date and active.

Next on the agenda were ideas for future Education Corners: Elementary hybridizing will be taught by Bruce Kovach. Other ideas presented were: garden pests, insecticides, identifying weeds and rust control, both systemic and contact.

A discussion about how the MAP point sale and auction functions was next on the agenda. The Board voted 9-3 in favor of changing the maximum MAP point dollars spent on one plant to an unlimited amount. In other words, members can decide if they want to use all of their earned MAP points on one purchase. If their bid does not use all of their MAP points, their next purchase would fall under the previous guidelines of a \$75 maximum MAP points and a cash difference would have to be paid. As all Board members were not in agreement, the President stated that the motion had passed for one year and will be assessed after the sale for future sales. We will also have a sale table for a silent auction in which members may choose to use their MAP point dollars.

Leaving the Board because their terms of service have been completed are: Carolyn Herndon, David Healy and Jack Rigsby. Many thanks for your service to DSGA.

A nominating committee was formed to find members to fill the vacant Board positions. This committee will be: Carolyn Herndon, Jack Rigsby and Shirley Lesiuk. Shirley will send an email to the membership requesting members to contact any of them if they are interested in serving on the Board.

Angie said that we need an audit committee every 2 years and Jack Rigsby and Dennis Calbreath will be asked to complete that task.

Since Virgil Herndon, our plant sale chairman, will be out-of-town for the Duluth sale, Ron McClure has generously offered to take that position. The Herndons will send information to Karen Mowry to email the membership about the sale.

The meeting adjourned at 4 p.m.


